**CITING DOCUMENTS IN DBQ'S:**

X = replace with actual document number

- 1) (Author of document) stated " \_\_\_\_\_ " (Doc. X)
- 2) *(idea or claim put in your own words)* (Doc. X)

**EXAMPLES**

- 1) In an editorial by the New York Times in August 1889.... (Doc. 2)
- 2) The political cartoon titled "Rough Sailing Ahead" demonstrated the weaknesses of the Articles of Confederation (Doc. 4)
